



#### DID YOU KNOW?

- Israel's occupation of Palestine is the only military occupation in the world today?
- 70% of all Palestinians are refugees?
- Palestinian refugees are the largest refugee group in the world?
- The occupation violates international law and United Nations resolutions?
- The "separation barrier" is actually a 30-foot-high concrete wall with armed towers that when complete will be 450 feet long, twice the length of the 1948 armistice line.
- The wall is made of highly electrified razor wire with motion detectors in unpopulated areas?
- The Apartheid Wall snakes through the West Bank and Jerusalem, prohibiting Palestinians' freedom of movement, cutting them off from jobs, fields, schools and for some, even their families?
- More than 600 checkpoints, roadblocks, trenches or debris obstacles cut off the freedom of movement throughout the West Bank?
- Israeli Occupation Forces have demolished about 27,000 homes since 1967?
- More than 500,000 Jewish colonial settlers live in settlements, outposts as well as homes that were confiscated from Palestinians?
- Since 1967, Israel has arrested about 20 percent of the population living in the West Bank and Gaza?
- Each year, the Israeli military arrests about 700 children?
- Jerusalem municipal authorities evict Palestinians from their homes and the city to keep the ratio of Jews to Palestinians in Jerusalem at 70:30?

# HOW MUCH MONEY IS THAT AND WHAT COULD IT HAVE DONE FOR AMERICANS INSTEAD?

Below is a small sampling of the economic impact for Americans. To check your state, go to www.endtheoccupation.org.

# WITHIN 10 YEARS:

Illinois will have contributed \$1.5 billion. Each year of the 10-year-period, that money would have paid for affordable housing for 18,000 people; OR early reading programs for 44,000 children, OR provided 1.2 million people with healthcare.

New Jersey will have contributed \$1.3 billion. Over 10 years, that money would have paid for affordable housing for 16,000 people; OR early reading programs for 40,000 children, OR provided 1 million people with healthcare.

New York contributed \$2.5 billion. Over 10 years, that money would have paid for affordable housing for 31,000 people; OR early reading programs for 74,000 children, OR provided 2 million people with healthcare.

California contributed \$3.5 billion. Over 10 years, that money would have paid for affordable housing for 42,000 people; OR early reading programs for 103,000 children, OR provided 3 million people with healthcare.



### **ISRAEL: AN ALLY OR A LIABILITY?**

Even though the U.S. consistently calls Israel a "close friend and ally," Israel at times has violated American law by misusing weapons obtained from the United States. Israel also has tried to sell American military technology to other countries, some of which are not allied with the United States.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

- Israel illegally used weapons such as cluster bombs and white phosphorus?
- Israel was caught trying to sell US military technology to enemy states?
- Israel bombed the USS Liberty in 1967, killing 34 US service members?
- Jonathan Pollard, who held both American and Israeli citizenship and was an intelligence analyst for the U.S. Navy, was convicted of spying for Israel in 1985?
- Steven J. Rosen and Keith Weissman, of the AIPAC lobby, were indicted in 2005 for espionage. Prosecutors dropped the charges for "national security" reasons.

### **DOES ISRAEL REALLY WANT PEACE?**

"It would be better to drown these prisoners [Palestinians] in the Dead Sea if possible, since that's the lowest point in the world," *Foreign Minister Avigdore Lieberman.*<sup>3</sup>

Palestinians are "drugged cockroaches in a bottle." Rafael Eiten, former head of Israeli Occupation Forces.<sup>4</sup>

"... We will have to kill and kill and kill. All day, every day ... If we don't kill, we will cease to exist." Arnon Sofer, head of the Israeli army's National Defense College.<sup>5</sup>
